Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture has issued this permit under the authority of section 21 of the Plant Pest Act, act of December 16, 1992, P.L. 1228, No. 162 § 21, (3 P.S. § 258.21(a) and (c)) for the purpose of preventing, delaying and minimizing the spread, dissemination and amplification of Spotted lanternfly in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

The Participant shall effectuate, follow and adhere to the requirements set by the Spotted Lanternfly Order of Quarantine and Treatment, as of May 26, 2018, 48 PA.B. 3094 and Quarantine Addendum as of March 16, 2019, 49 PA.B. 1155.

Train your employees

Distribute permits

Make copies of the permit (top section of this tri-fold) and ensure placement in company vehicles. The permit copy should be kept inside the vehicle with the registration packet or in a permit book (if used).

Document your efforts

Recordkeeping of employee training, inspection of vehicles, control measures taken and shipping records must be maintained for a minimum of two years.
